Recreation Trail and Restoration Opportunities

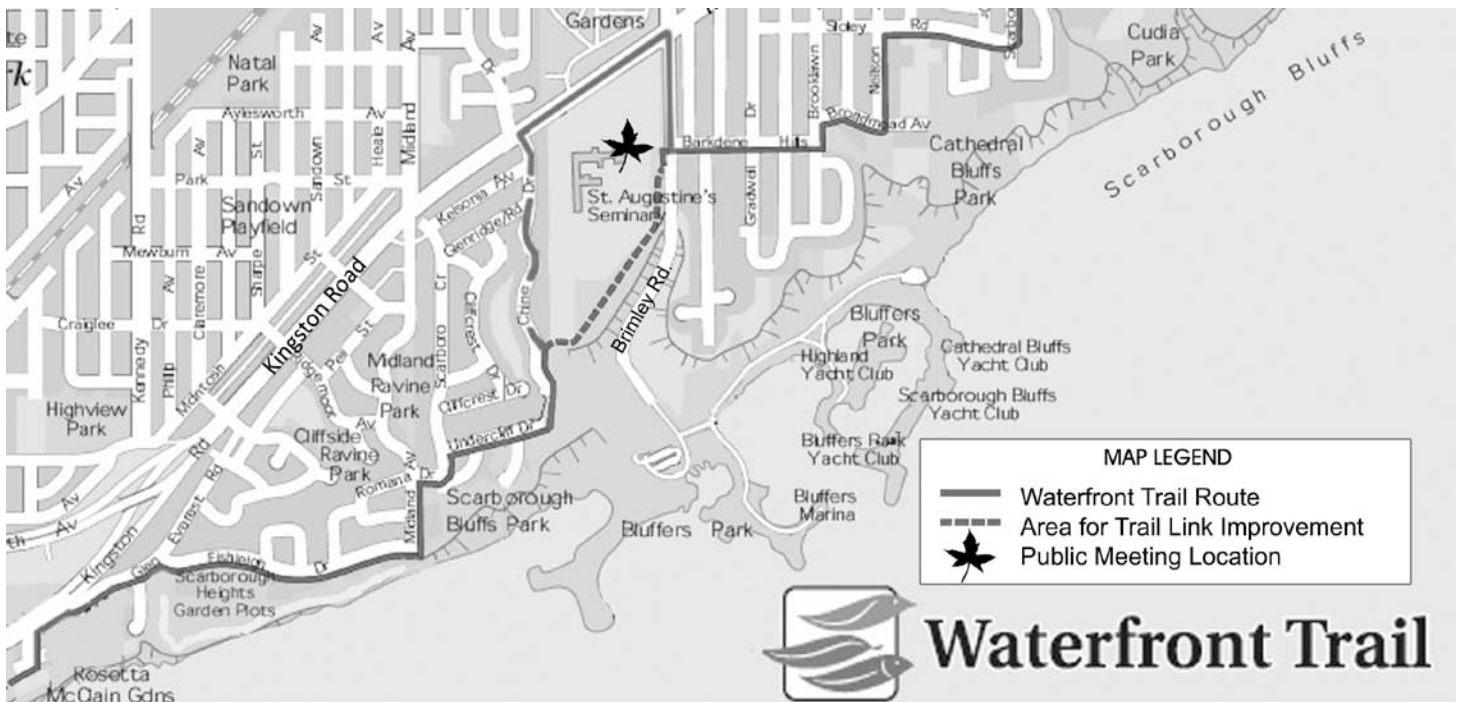
We invite you to a public meeting to review various possible trail alignments for Bluffer's Park:

Background

The City of Toronto is working on improving multi-use trails across the Scarborough waterfront, as part of the City's Trail Plan. The trail along the Scarborough waterfront is also part of the Waterfront Trail system which provides a waterfront connection between Niagara-on-the-Lake and the Quebec border. Bluffer's Park is an important linkage.

Improvements to the Bluffer's Park trail will: allow for the re-location of the Waterfront Trail away from busy Kingston Road; provide a neighbourhood connector between Undercliff Drive and Brimley Road South; create a multi-use trail that can be used by walkers and cyclists, as well as allow people with various degrees of accessibility needs to experience the views and the natural environment.
